



Ben Kurten Co-Presents on J-1 Two-Year Home Residency Waiver for Foreign Physicians

Ben Kurten co-presented "[Navigating the J-1 Two-Year Home Residency Waiver for Physicians](#)," a business immigration seminar offered by the American Immigration Lawyers Association (AILA). Ben offered his insights in this live and on-demand CLE-eligible course designed for immigration lawyers dealing with foreign physicians and medical students.
